Could your dog have osteoarthritis?

Osteoarthritis (OA) is a degenerative joint disease that can be painful and can affect dogs of all ages, breeds and sizes. If left untreated, the pain can become worse over time.

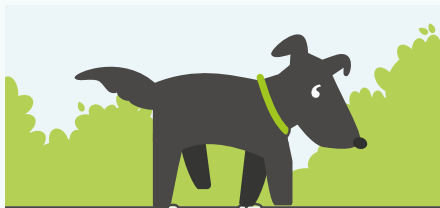
This checklist is designed to help with the recognition of OA pain to help keep your dog happy and active. Your veterinary team will review the results of this checklist with you to identify if your dog might be suffering from OA and discuss which joint(s) might be affected.

Think about your dog's activity in the past week.

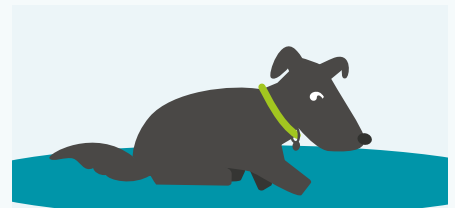
Tick all of the signs that you've observed in your dog as shown below.



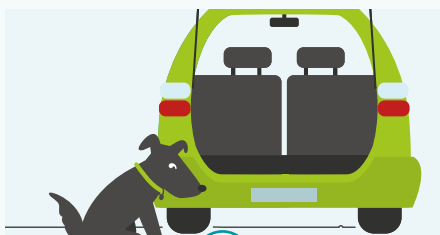
Limping after exercise



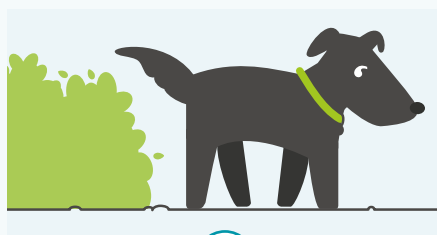
Lagging behind on walks



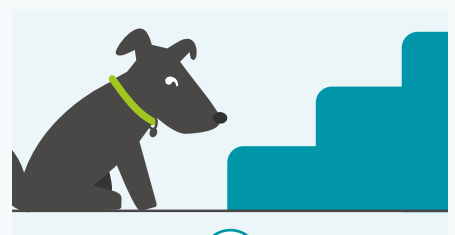
Slow to rise

Feeling stiff



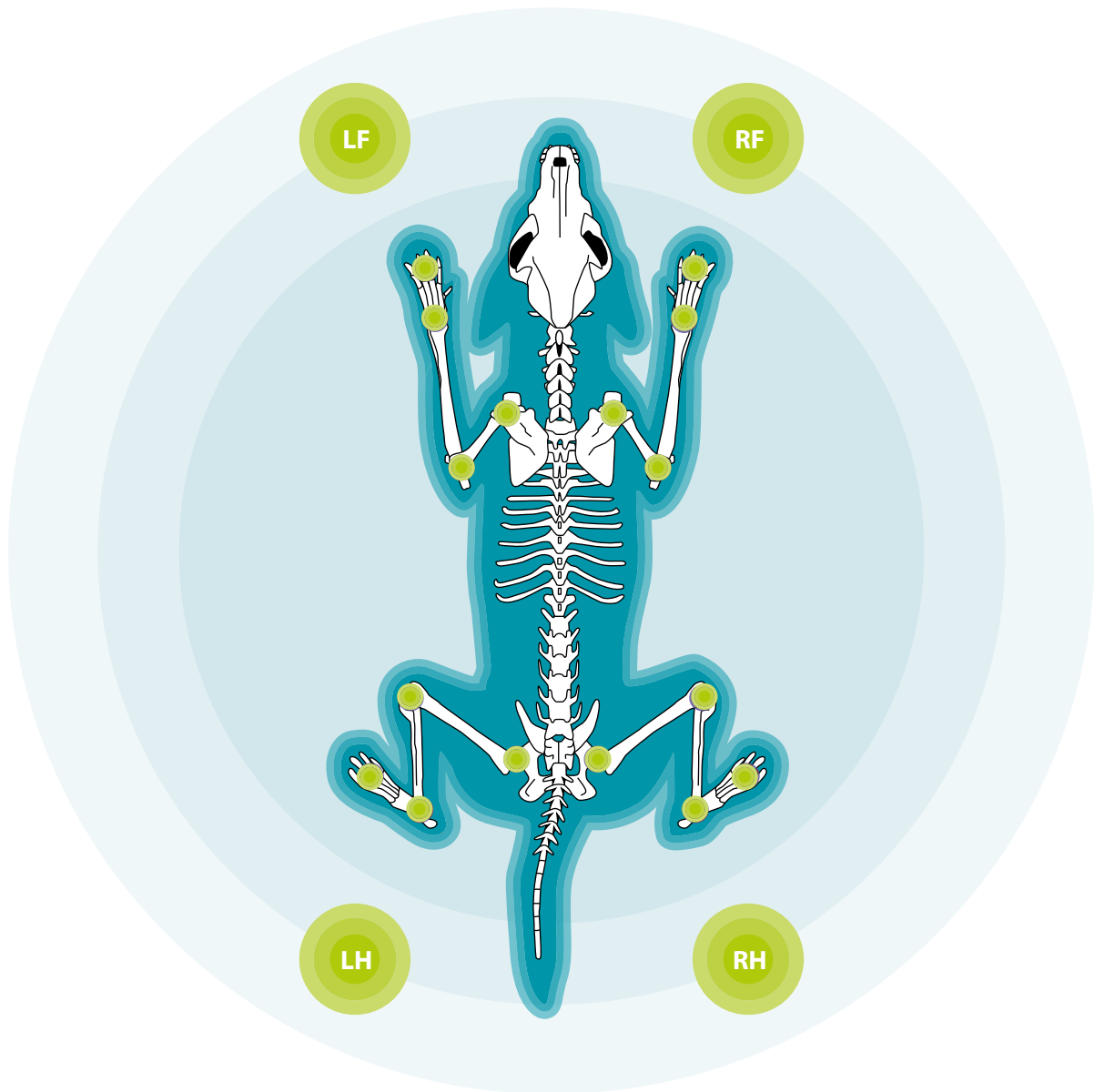
Difficulty with stairs
